As we begin the Nativity Fast and prepare to celebrate our Savior's birth, it is once again time for us, as a community, to consider how to be good stewards of what the Lord has given us. To be stewards means to remember that all we have is "from above." The Lord calls us to use what He has given us to serve Him and His Body. This includes the resources of our time and our abilities, as well as our financial resources. These three kinds of blessings—our time, our talents, and our treasure—are the sacrificial gifts we offer our Lord, like gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

The Biblical standard for giving " is the tithe: 10% of what we receive. Of course, the tithe really represents all that we have and all that we are—our whole selves offered up to God. How we tithe our time and talents may not be as obvious to us as how we tithe our treasure. To help us consider ways to contribute to the life of St. Nicholas, there is a ministry list enclosed, with jobs that need to be done in a healthy, vibrant parish.

As we consider our stewardship commitment, it is good to remember that "God loves a cheerful giver." Whatever we give, let it be the "widow's mite" that comes from a grateful heart, full of child-like delight in pleasing the Heavenly Father. May the gifts of our time, talents, and treasure be joined with the sacrifice that God most desires: a heart that is humble and dedicated to Him.
